

2nd July Transition Day


We will be spending time in our new classrooms with our new teachers.

They loved serving in the café at the Enterprise Fair.










Hazel class Y2

Oak & Poplar class Y3


Year 3 have really enjoyed making bracelets and working on their stall at the Enterprise Fair.
